DEMONSTRATIONS of improving their river habitat including coppicing, bank management.

SEE experts modelling feathers into creature look-alikes good enough to fool a fish... and between 10:00 and 14:00 make them dance and swim to catch a fish to admire close up and return to the river.

Where? A safe, secure, flat field beside the Midford Brook in Midford village BA2 7DD. Access next to Midford Garages on the east side of the Brook and west of Midford Lane. Parking available. What3Words **neon/spoon/care**

Who? Those interested in river conservation and country pursuits. Children – very welcome if over 12 and accompanied by responsible adults at all times. Bank walk - (approx. 0.5 miles) is semi-rough in places. You need to be able to walk unaided on uneven sloping ground, and to get over a stile. Walking shoes/wellingtons advisable.
